



Commission Completes Move

The South Carolina Workers' Compensation Commission recently completed a move from their Marion Street offices to Main Street. The move was a result of an expiring lease which resulted in an evaluation of needed work space as well as potential for cost savings. The Commission accomplished both. Over the next seven years, the savings will total \$587,000 or over \$6,900 per month.

Change is inevitable with any move. The Commission will occupy 4,000 square feet less but the entire agency will be located on one floor making the processes flow much better.

Additionally, parking has changed. A limited number of parking spaces will be available in the surface lot behind the building. Guests will have to depress the button at the security gate and wait for security to direct them to the proper parking space(s). Additional or overflow parking will be available in a nearby city parking garage.

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

Pay Careful Attention to Certificates of Workers' Compensation Coverage

South Carolina recognizes the concept of "statutory employment" in workers' compensation claims.

Basically, this means that an upper tier contractor or project owner can become the "statutory employer" of injured employees of subcontractors for purposes of paying workers' compensation indemnity and medical benefits when the worker's immediate employer had no coverage at the time of the injury.

In 1996, the General Assembly passed a law to enable upper tier contractors or project owners protection from such claims if they obtain documentation of insurance coverage from subcontractors at the time when the contractor or subcontractor is engaged to perform work on a project. The protection offered by the statute is the opportunity to transfer liability for a claim brought by an uninsured contractor's employee from the statutory employer to the South Carolina Uninsured Employers' Fund.

The forms which the Workers' Compensation Commission has designated for purposes of documenting workers' compensation insurance coverage are "Forms 25-S" and authorized self-insurance certificates. Forms 25-S must be obtained from authorized representatives of insurance carriers. Authorized self-insurance certificates are obtained from the Workers' Compensation Commission.

By regulation, the Workers' Compensation Commission requires that a Form 25-S must be dated, signed, and issued by an authorized representative of the insurance carrier for the insured. In recent cases, the appellate courts have strictly construed these requirements. Attempts by statutory employers to transfer liability to the Uninsured Employers' Fund have failed due to such defects in the Form 25-S as where there was no signature by an authorized representative of the insurance carrier for the insured, where the expiration dates of the coverage shown had expired prior to the date of injury, where the description of the project for which the Form 25-S was obtained was different than the project upon which the subcontractor's employee was injured, or where the Form 25-S was otherwise incomplete.


Employers wishing to rely on certificates of insurance from subcontractors must pay careful attention to the Forms 25-S that they receive and be prepared to see that they are updated as time goes by and projects change in order to assure that the certificates of insurance that they have on file remain in compliance with the statute, the applicable regulation and the recent case law.

Review Forms 25-S as follows:

- Be sure each Form 25-S is dated, signed, and issued by an authorized representative of the insurance carrier for the insured.
- Be aware of the coverage expiration dates and obtain an additional Form 25-S from the insured each time coverage is renewed.
- Remember that if the insured contractor works on more than one project for your company, you need a Form 25-S for each project.
- Be sure the form is complete. In a recently decided case, the "Description of Operation box" was left blank. The Supreme Court ruled that accepting an incomplete form "does not constitute proper documentation."

Pay Careful Attention to Certificates continued

If you have doubts as to whether a Form 25-S is in compliance with the statute, the regulation, or the recent case law, consult your attorneys.

Why is this so important?

Having a valid Form 25-S on file could enable a statutory employer to transfer liability to the Uninsured Employers' Fund for a lifetime benefit claim where the totals paid in workers' compensation indemnity and medical benefits could easily exceed a million dollars.

Imagine having to explain to your supervisor why the transfer of liability for such a claim failed because you had not noticed that the dates of coverage had expired, or that the form described a different project than the one in which the subcontractor was engaged at the time of the accident, or that the form which the insurance agent faxed to your office had no signature from an authorized representative of the insurance carrier, or that the form was otherwise incomplete.




Is Your Membership Current?
